City of Nanaimo following updated Provincial Health Orders

Summary

Updates to Provincial Health Orders that were announced on March 10, 2022 mean the following changes:

- the wearing of masks will no longer be required starting on March 11, 2022 for those visiting City of Nanaimo facilities or for those participating in programs, but masks will be encouraged where physical distancing is difficult to maintain
- as of April 8, 2022, the City of Nanaimo is expecting not to be required to check proof of vaccination to participate in programs
- facility capacities are now at 100 percent capacity, including at pools and arenas

Masks will still be available at City of Nanaimo facilities, and hand sanitization and cleaning protocols will continue to be in place.

The City of Nanaimo will continue to follow provincial health orders. This includes transitioning from a COVID-19 Safety Plan to a City-wide Communicable Disease Prevention Exposure Control Plan.

Any further changes will be reflected on the website and communicated through social media.
