City offers grants for environmental projects

Grant applications for watershed restoration and other environmental and sustainability projects now open

Summary

Beginning February 14, 2025, the City of Nanaimo will be accepting applications for two separate grants focused on funding community environmental projects. These grants help implement Nanaimo's City Plan goals and improve livability in our community. Projects may focus on park restoration, urban stream and riparian enhancement, natural environment protection and climate change adaptation solutions.

The Community Watershed Restoration Grant provides up to \$20,000 in grant funds and is available annually to community organizations, environmental non-profits and individual residents that aim to carry out watershed restoration projects. These projects will focus on urban stream and riparian restoration enhancement and natural environment protection. Eligible applicants are encouraged to apply for funding. Projects that have received funding from the Community Watershed Restoration grant in the past include invasive species removal and restoration along Joseph and McGregor Creeks, water quality monitoring on Diver Lake and wetland restoration at a housing co-operative.

The Community Environmental Sustainability Project Grant was created to support small and creative environmental projects not already covered by existing City of Nanaimo grants, including the Community Watershed Restoration Grant. A total of \$20,000 in grant funds has been available annually since 2023. Up to \$5,000 in project funding will be available per application. Eligible community organizations, including environmental nonprofits, local stewardship groups, school groups, religious organizations and participants in the Acting for Climate Together program are encouraged to apply.

Funding will be used to support projects that improve the environmental health of natural systems, enhance resident connections to nature, provide educational values, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and/or prepare the community for climate change impacts. Projects that have received funding from the Community Environmental Sustainability Project Grant in the past include a neighbourhood tree planting workshop, environmental restoration and student education project in Wardropper Park and the use of thermal imaging cameras to educate homeowners about energy efficiency in homes.

Key Points

- The City is inviting applications for two environmental action grants concurrently. The Community Watershed Restoration Grant is for restoration and habitat protection projects near a river, lake or wetland and the Community Environmental Sustainability Project Grant supports a wide variety of sustainability projects.
- Up to \$20,000 in total project funding is available for the Community Watershed Restoration Grants and the Community Environmental Sustainability Project Grant (up to \$5,000 per project) respectively.
